

### Meeting Summary, HLAATC meeting November 19, 2023 By Laura Hagemann, Vice President

*Note: The November meeting* presentation and now the (fixed) October presentation is our HLAA-TC <u>YouTube Channel</u>.

Robin "Byrdie" Coninx started the hybrid chapter meeting of HLAA-TC (with attendees both at Courage Kenny in Golden Valley, MN and on Zoom). She introduced the speakers Dr. Susan Sealy Arquette, PhD (also the current HLAA-TC secretary) and Tobias Wilde, MSW, LICSW and gave the floor over to them for this HYBRID presentation. Susan was virtually on Zoom joining us while Tobias was presenting at Courage Kenny. Tobias Wilde is from the Minnesota Department of Human Services, Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services, a mental health specialist, and a licensed independent clinical social worker (serving the Moorhead area) and Susan was a licensed psychologist for 36 years until she retired 2 years ago. Tobias was a sign language interpreter for 15 years and after interpreting in some mental health settings, decided to go back to get his master's degree because he felt there is a disconnect, "a bridge that needs to be built between therapist and those with hearing loss." They noted that 28.8 million people across the country have some kind of hearing loss.

Tobias shared that the first thing hearing loss can do for many (in terms of mental health) is create a lot of anxiety. Tobias gave two examples of people reacting to their hearing loss: a man who hid his hearing loss and coped with his anxiety by over-talking and dominating conversations so he wouldn't show his hearing loss by not hearing someone else speaking; and a woman who self-isolated and hid from social situations so she didn't show her hearing loss. In both scenarios anxiety is present with the hearing loss.

Susan shared her personal experience of having her hearing worsen each time she was tested in her twenties and thirties, and deciding to get hearing aids. She said that while she was elated with how hearing aids improved her hearing it was nonetheless anxiety-provoking to experience the increased decline in her hearing. Susan shared that, "hearing loss can be associated with isolation, depression, cognitive decline and other negative health outcomes." Signs of anxiety include "a decrease in interest or enjoyment in activities that the person previously enjoyed, changes in weight and appetite - either loss of appetite or eating for comfort, and disturbed sleep."

They spoke of the importance of self-care and finding a balance between self-isolating and frustration. Susan gave many practical tips such as planning ahead, and having a hearing partner who makes sure you understand. They also mentioned various technologies to help (telecoils, Bluetooth, FM systems, pocket talkers) all with the aim to ease anxiety and prevent social isolation. 

We will meet in the Board Room on the second floor of Courage Kenny Rehabilitation Institute in Golden Valley (3915 Golden Valley Road).


